Teesdale Guardians.

THE WASTAGE ON STORED COAL.

Mr John Smith, J.P., presided at a meeting on Wednesday, when one Clerk (Mr G. Sainbridge) read a circular from the Spand of Trade on the subject of the coal suppry and the advisability of laying in a stock of that mineral as early as possible, no as to guard against a possible shortage and increased prices during the winter consequent upon many cost miners being ongaged in the war. - her G. Linsley (Cockfield), a miner, pointed out that the longer cost was kept in stock the more is perished and the less valuable it became as a heat-giver.—The Chairman said that was a new theory altogether .- Mr Linsley: It is no new theory. Ask Mr Widdae .-- Mr Percy Widdus, was is manager of a Onekfield Colliery, said coal was likely to lose 20 per cent. of value by keeping. -- Mr Linsley: The Local Severament Sound does not know all .- The Clork: It is the Board of Trade this time. - Mr Lineley: And they don't know all. -Mr R. W. Young said the coal shortage would not affect Toesdate so much as some other districts.- The Clerk: If the war came to an ead in three months, would not the prices go down? - Mr Linsley: They might go up,-Mr T. Tarn: It takes a bonnie lot of getting down. (Laughter). - Mr H. L. Bife, J.P.: Nearly as much as the wages. (Renewed laughter).—The Clerk said see contracts would be let at the next meeting, and the coal contract, which was for three months, would expire at the end of the present month. — Mr. R. Armstroug, J.P., said he thought the matter might well stand over until the next meeting. — Mr. J. W. I. Davidson, J.P.: Why not make the cost contract for six months ?-The Chairman : You have board that the price may go down. We hope the war won't last so long as some people nuticipate. It may be done within three months.—Mr W. H. Ralston, J.P., said the Guardians could do nothing in view of the Coni Prices Limitation Act, which prevented an increase of more than 4s, per ton on last year's prices. If coal depreciated 20 per cent. in stock it would be profitable to make the ordinary strangements for a supply. He moved that that course be adopted.—Mr Armstrong seconded .- Agreed to.

Means of Disinfecting. The Chairman reported that the disinfecting apparatus at the Workhouse had become rusty and uspless, and a new one was wanted. had been to see the apparatus at the County School, and he thought a similar one would be very suitable for the Workhouse. It would, however, cost £120, and he did not know whether the price would be as suitable as the article riself. In addition, there would be the expense of enclosing it in a suitable house and the provision of a fine. If one could be erected so that the steam from the existing boller could be utilised in connection with it, the cost might be considerably less. He

suggested that further inquiries be made, -- The Guardians agreed.
